

Language School

English Programs

At our Language School, students can undertake academic English programs to support their studies.



Beginner English (General English)

Course Code: 078838J

This course is designed to introduce students to the early stages of English language acquisition in order to prepare them for the more academic style of English taught in the PSS program.



Preparation for Secondary Studies (PSS)

Course Code: 078837K

This course is an English language program specifically designed to prepare students for entry into secondary school. The course includes some subject content to ensure students become familiar with the vocabulary and terminology needed to study secondary school subjects successfully.

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English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D)

Course Code: 093594K

This course is designed for Year 11 and 12 students who speak another language or dialect as their 'home' language. EAL/D focuses on developing the competent use of Standard Australian English in various contexts and teaching academic English skills needed for tertiary studies.

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English Language & Australian Cultural Studies (ELACS)

Course Code: 094026A

This course is studied as part of the Western Australian Universities' Foundation Program (WAUFP), an academic study pathway which guarantees entry to top public universities in Western Australia, for those who successfully complete the program.

Foundation

The Western Australian
Universities' Foundation Program
(WAUFP) has helped international
students to achieve their study
goals since 1993.

- The WAUFP is a one-year program for Year 12 students.
- International students who successfully complete the WAUFP and who satisfy the course entry requirements are guaranteed a place at the WA public university of their choice.
- The WAUFP is also recognised by leading Australian universities in other states.

WAUFP students study at least four subjects, including English Language and Australian Cultural Studies (ELACS). Success in ELACS means that students meet the English competency requirement necessary for university entrance in WA.

Performance in each subject is assessed by the student's school. The moderated school assessments and final external examination marks are combined on a 50:50 basis and then scaled using an ability test to produce the final scaled marks in each subject.

A Combined Percentage Score (CPS) is calculated for all students and can be used for university entrance. The CPS is calculated by averaging the best three scaled scores (excluding ELACS) OR averaging the sum of the best three scaled scores and ELACS score, whichever is the higher, plus any bonuses.
